DIRECTOR'S UPDATE

Cedar Lake Ministries turned 110 years old this year!! Over 750 children attended camp this year, almost 300 adults attended retreats, and we expect 5,700 guests from churches, schools and families to have stayed in our facilities by the end of the year. It's truly a blessing to see so many lives being changed on these hallowed grounds.

Our new Winter Retreat Specials are starting to get the attention of people that want to come here to enjoy the beauty of His creation at the lake during the fall and winter. Consider joining us for our Christmas Gala (12/6); registrations are now open.

There are so many exciting things happening here. In addition to impacting the lives of children and adults, many of the historic buildings are being revitalized and a new addition to camp has been built.

- We have invested in rebuilding Torrey Auditorium and Rest-A-While lodge and are now focused on restoring the beloved and historic Lakeview bunkhouse that was built in the late 1800s. Our current focus is on the roof, exterior and windows.
- In addition to restoring camp, we are excited to announce that last year's vision of building a large (60'x 128') multi-use Pavilion has been realized. Children attending the last week of summer camp were able to enjoy the structure and, at the end of September, we held a night of worship to dedicate the new Pavilion and thank Him for His provision. The band from Faith Church Cedar Lake led worship for well over 125 people that enjoyed the event. We hope to have a concrete floor installed so multiple sports can be played inside, the sounds of worship concerts can fill the air, and various other uses can occur.

We are truly grateful to all the people that He has used to help us revitalize camp and build the Pavilion. If you'd like to be a part of the camp's revitalization, please visit our website to learn more about getting involved.

Restorations & Improvements

We are continuing our efforts to revive these historic grounds. The biggest parts of these efforts are the restoration of Lakeview and the addition of our new pavilion.

Lakeview is the oldest building at our camp and needed a major restoration in order to continue serving as one of our bunkhouses. Since our last newsletter, we have nearly completed the process of replacing the roof. We have also begun the process of replacing the windows and siding. Volunteers have played a major role in our ability to make this progress as you will see below. Please continue to pray for the financial and safety needs of our team as we continue this project.

We have also been very blessed by the opportunity to use our new pavilion. We had a time of worship and prayer as we dedicated this new space to the service of the Lord. The next step now is to add a concrete floor. Please join us in praying for the Lord's continued provision as we raise the necessary funds.



WHAT'S THE IMPACT?

Our team has made great progress on several projects recently - thanks to the help of Bethel Young Adults and Hillside Community Church. The Bethel group removed old siding on Lakeview, installed new plywood on the exterior walls, and painted the wood trim around the windows in preparation for aluminum wrapping. Hillside helped remove our ministry pier, raked leaves, and gave the Hickory bunkhouse a deep clean. We are so grateful for our dedicated volunteers. Truly, many hands make for lighter work!
